The importance of serving and supporting the library cannot be overstated. Public libraries are essential to communities in numerous ways. Public libraries act as a cornerstone for education, community engagement, local history and personal growth. Public libraries are an invaluable asset to the communities they serve.

The FOL is a nonprofit corporation; nonprofits succeed by the efforts of volunteers. A robust volunteer organization needs volunteers; our FOL is no exception. We need active committed volunteers! These are ways members can support our FOL:

- Book sleuths: sort donated books;
- Newsletter editor: produce quarterly recap of FOL activities;
- Marketing & Publicity: promote the FOL & the Library;
- Homebound & Preschool programs: once a month, drive to the schools or homebound patrons to exchange book baskets;
- **Book sales**: moving book boxes, setting out books, working with patrons during the sale, cashiering, and assisting with take down;
- **Bake sales**: donating baked treats, setting up and cleaning up afterwards, enjoying the patrons and of course, being good customers ourselves;

- **Book donations**: please donate books in gently used condition, either newer releases or older, vintage books, paperbacks in good condition: book sales are the main source of income.
- Online book sales: place unique books up for sale or auction and post to buyers.

We need our members to attend meetings and actively participate, make suggestions, help with activities. What time you can share with the FOL is valuable, a few hours monthly or weekly make a big difference.

2024 events included a Valentine's Day bake sale, and spring and fall book sales; a children's/YA book sale was held before the end of the school year. We distributed a lot of books inexpensively to the community; and, of special importance to me, many children's and young adult books reached young readers.

The FOL purchased books, paid for children's programs and genealogy recourses. Expenses are pending for book orders; the annual magazine subscription and we have a new webpage and database. On December 19th, the FOL is sponsoring a children's Christmas celebration including a visit from Mr. & Mrs. Santa Claus, cookie decorating, hot cocoa and prizes and gifts. Please, bring your children, grandchildren and invite your neighbors.

In parting, let me ask you as members, to donate time and materials, support the library's extensive adult and children's programs and speak up on behalf of public libraries; tell our local and state leadership that the library is a vital and vibrant community asset.

My best wishes for a happy and healthy holiday season filled with love and kindness and I sincerely hope we all enjoy a prosperous and peaceful new year!
