Homebound and Preschool Delivery and Exchange

Friends of the Library, Boone County Arkansas became a 501 (c)(3) in 1990's with serving the library as its mission. FOL volunteers raise funds through book and bake sales, memberships and donations to purchase books and support library programming; a tradition that continues.

This year, the FOL will allocate:

- \$8,000 to purchase new books
- \$1,500 for children's summer programs
- \$ 300 towards the children's "1000 Books Read" program
- \$ 400 donated to the genealogy department

Volunteers deliver books to homebound patrons in our community. Homebound status isolates people, restricts access to goods and services and a person can become, simply, lonely. We believe our homebound deliveries help; our volunteers forge bonds with our patrons and care about their wellbeing.

Volunteers distribute and exchange baskets of books to preschools. Each basket holds 25 books. Currently we deliver about 400 books to nine schools; two are open all year while the remaining seven close for a summer break:

- Alpena Learning Center 2 baskets
- Alpena ABC Preschool 2 baskets
- Bergman Elementary 4 baskets
- Forest Heights Elementary (new this semester) 2 baskets
- Little Red Schoolhouse 2 baskets
- Giggles & Grins Preschool 2 baskets
- Harrison Preschool 1 basket
- Room to Bloom 2 baskets
- The Learning Center 1 basket

These books are donated or purchased by FOL and mirror the Boone County Library collection so the availability of books at the library is not impacted. We want to show children that books are fun and help teachers raise another generation of readers.



Stand Up to Stand Out

By unanimous vote at our August FOL board meeting, Janet McMurrin was chosen to be this year's third quarter Stand Up to Stand Out award honoree.



Janet was born and raised in Harrison and has been with FOL since about 1997. She worked with Carolyn & George Cline in those early days to transition the old library card catalog system into a database. In appreciation of her work, she was honored with a governor's volunteer award in 1997. She enjoyed working with the Clines and spoke highly and affectionately of them. George encouraged her to go to college.



After that, Janet took on more projects at our library. She served as backup for many library positions and helped set up the first four public access computers with internet. With the goal of becoming a school librarian, she earned certification and degrees in that field. Along the way, Janet became a member of our FOL board, and she has been the webmaster ever since 2004. She is currently a Business & IT Assistant Professor at North Arkansas College.

Janet's love of books began early. She has fond memories of the Grandma's Attic series by Arleta Richardson. Based on true stories from the author's grandmother, who was one hundred years older than Janet, the stories spoke to her. Janet still has a letter she received from the author.

Anne of Green Gables is one of Janet's favorite book characters. She enjoys juvenile books from the 1950s-1980s, Christian fiction and classics written by Jane Austen and Eleanor H. Porter. But her favorite book of all is the Bible, "the Bible is eternal", which she reads every day.

Janet tends to read more than one book at a time, be it on her Kindle or hard copy. She also enjoys listening to books with Alexa. Janet has four bookcases of books and over a thousand books on Kindle, many she hasn't read yet.

Besides reading, Janet likes to make ice cream and cookies, hike with her friends, take pictures of nature (especially flowers!) and keep bees. She enjoys history and loves to visit old one-room schoolhouses.

When asked what book should be required reading for everyone, Janet doesn't hesitate to say the Bible. "It has all the answers for life's problems."

Thank you, Janet, for your selfless decades of hard work, dedication and expertise you've contributed to our library, our Friends organization and our community.
